



EGGHEAD AND TWINKIE



THE RADICAL is an intimate portrait of the world's first openly gay imam.

Muhsin Hendricks was a fashion designer in South Africa, who struggled to reconcile his sexuality with his faith. He studied in Pakistan to become an imam—a religious leader—so that he could understand Islam more deeply.

After deciding that he had to be truthful to himself and the world, he came out in 1995, and established the radically-inclusive mosque in Cape Town that gave rise to the global queer Muslim network. Today, Hendricks leads a devoted group of LGBTQ+ Muslims and allies, based in a working-class neighborhood of the city. He decides to take his work to where it is needed most: the East African communities living under anti-LGBTQ+ laws.

The film provides first-person accounts of growing up queer in a society caught between the liberalism of the South African Constitution and the conservativeness of its cultures and history. In the wider African context, it chronicles individual journeys to acceptance amidst the struggle for LGBTQ+ rights on the continent.

This film contains descriptions of homophobic violence.





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

Three queer adolescent friends living in the underbelly of Toronto, each reveling in the newfound freedom of their summer break. Julien, a runaway, has been taken in by Dawn, a trans woman who has adopted the role of guiding him through the challenges of being a young queer carving out a place for himself in the world. Julien, alongside his youthful gang, is determined to sneak into a local gay club this summer, yearning for the experience behind its forbidden walls. Otis, a timid boy, follows Julien with intrigue and adoration for his effortless irreverence, while Tony, a bright young trans girl brings spirit and optimism to the group.

Julien, Otis, and Tony succeed in their nightlife mission by stealing the wallet of a man that Dawn seems to know intimately. However, when Dawn fails to return home later that night, the trio band together to find her. Untrusting of authority, they hatch a plan to confront the man whose wallet they stole, ultimately setting fire to the double life he leads. As Julien sinks deeper and deeper into his guilt, a brutal discovery reveals how much darker the journey for truth really is.



After Minnie Bouvèé has Poodles Makenzie's crew brutally slaughtered, she braces for the blowback; what she doesn't expect, however, is to be stalked by a creepy masked figure who leaves behind bouquets of gardenias and terrifying notes. Is this Poodles' revenge, or the work of Minnie's estranged sister who stole her man years ago and has suddenly reappeared in her life?

Jesus is one of the most well-known figures in history. Since he roamed the hills of Palestine 2000 years ago, billions of people from myriad nations have followed his teaching that all are welcome and that every person is created to love and be loved. Yet despite the many ethnicities and identities of his followers, Jesus almost always has been depicted in paintings, sculptures, and film as a white, blond-haired, blue-eyed, cisgender male.

The film makers seek change by shattering centuries of religious imagery and iconography that always depicts Jesus the same way. They brought together and led a team of creatives of unique talent to create photo art of nine models of diverse ethnicities, races, genders, and sexual and gender identities depicting Jesus as one of them.

Never before has the world seen a Black or Latinx or Asian or female or gay or lesbian or non-binary or transgender Jesus praying for peace for all peoples; beaten senseless, as so many LGBTQ+ have been; or crowned with thorns and hanging on a cross, bleeding the colors of the rainbow.

Two young women navigate love for the first time. Kawenniióhstha, half-Iranian and half-Mohawk, has just moved to Toronto, to pursue her dream of becoming a poet. Raised by her single Kanien'kehá:ka mother in Kahnawà:ke Mohawk territory, she never knew her dad. Her estranged father also lives in Toronto but he does not know she exists. She yearns to meet him, but struggles to make contact.

Malai's father's alcoholism reaches its peak after her mother dies, pushing her to leave home with her elder brother. Years later, as her father battles terminal cancer, she tries to reconcile with him, while navigating her brother's refusal to do the same.

Through two families complicated by love and loss, this film intimately explores the stories of those living in the liminal space between cultures, displaced both at home and abroad. At the centre of it all remains Kawenniióhstha and Malai, whose journeys we follow together and apart.





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
